KEEP YOUR EYE ON THE PRIZE

Stewardship spirituality invites us to surrender control of our lives to God in grateful recognition of the simple fact that all we have is a gift from Him.

Today's readings illustrate what amazing things can happen when we fully invite God to take charge of our lives by embracing the stewardship way of life.

When we take our eyes off God, we fail to see that all we have is a gift from Him. We lose trust in the Lord and we do not make our lives a grateful response to Him.

Peter makes this mistake in our Gospel passage from Matthew. Jesus sends the disciples in a boat ahead of Him to the other side of the shore. Later that evening, Jesus casually strolls up to the boat, walking on the sea. He invites Peter to join Him. As Peter begins to walk on the water, he momentarily takes his eyes off Jesus to notice the strong wind surrounding them. With that, he sinks.

But what if Peter had not taken his eyes off Christ? What a grand adventure he could have experienced walking on the sea with Jesus! When we take our eyes off Christ, the many blessings He has given us, and the loving way He treats us, we sink, too.

When we embrace the stewardship way of life - letting go of a tight hold over our money, time and talents - our lives become a grand adventure, rooted firmly and gratefully in the God Who always cares for us.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT DURING COVID-19

This is a sensitive topic to address with so many uncertainties that continue to impact each one of us in unexpected ways. Many parishioners may already be facing financial difficulties as a family, and the first priority must be to take care of the needs of family and loved ones.

Our Parish of St. Martin and our Diocese of St. Catharines continue to rely on the generosity of the faithful to financially run during this time of pandemic. Parishioners can continue to donate by dropping off their weekly donations to the parish rectory, or by mail, or now at the office on Tuesdays from 9:00 am to 12:00 Noon. .

Less than 10% of our parish membership have returned to the celebration of weekend and weekday Masses. There are many justified reason for this. Sitting in a comfortable chair in your home and online Mass seems more comfortable than a church pew. Habits are formed and are very difficult to break. But they do present a pastoral concern as we move forward at this Mid-Summer point and coming Fall season.

It is critical at this time our prayers of support for each other. We pray for the Parishes, all our Priests and Deacons, and our Diocese, for your fellow parishioners and our parish staff, and we remember those who are suffering from illness, especially those who have died from Covid-19; and frontline workers and essential service providers who have had to make a tremendous sacrifice affecting their families and loved ones during this ever present COVID-19 pandemic. We thank you for your continued financial support!

CELEBRATION OF BAPTISM IN COVID-19

Beginning August 1, we are returning to the celebration of Baptism. one family at a time and within our restricted protocols. Families will be informed of what is expected of them prior to the celebration.

All of the guidelines for a celebration of Mass are currently in place throughout the Diocese of St. Catharines and must be followed, including the number of people allowed to gather in a church and requiring physical distancing. The wearing of masks is now mandatory. ***Note:** Babies and small children are not required to wear masks. (Ten years old and up wear masks.) Please contact the parish to find out more details. We have had to put in writing the stipends required for both the parish and the parish priest since in the past there has been very few stipends offered. A set stipend has also been established.

We thank you in advance in adhering to our new protocols that keeps us all healthy and safe. Baptisms will take place Sunday afternoons at 2:00 pm. We will try and accommodate requests for families for another day other than a Sunday. Church will be sanitized prior and after the celebration of Baptism by our Covid Volunteers.

"ETIQUETTE AT EUCHARIST"

We update weekly given our experiences of the weekend Masses; and with Public Health and Regional Bylaws.

You will be asked to sanitize your hands using the new automatic dispenser (touchless) just inside the main door.

NEW! The wearing a face mask or shield are now mandatory throughout Niagara (except the very young and those with breathing difficulties). Masks are available free of charge.

Please wait for a hospitality team member to escort you to your assigned pew. In order to ensure physical distancing, please remain in your seats once seated. Do not decide to move because you want to sit with family or friends. We know that some have expressed a desire to sit where they usually do. This is not possible at this time.

Communicants are to remove their masks while the person ahead of them is receiving and bow; and after the priest says "the Body of Christ" and the answer "Amen" is given, only then does the communicant cross the red line (hands extended) to receive and step into the "marked circle" to consume the Bread of Life.

Note: The washrooms are to be used only if absolutely necessary; parishioners making their way there during Mass tend to be a distraction to the others. As well, please refrain from touching any surfaces upon entering or exiting the church (anything touched has to be cleaned).

The doors are closed (locked?) when Mass begins for a reason: the TEAM have a right to worship and are not obliged to wait unnecessarily. Also, attending one Mass on the weekend is sufficient; please be mindful of others by not taking a space someone else could have.

Lastly, be respectful of the ushers and cleaners and their tasks; their willingness to serve is of benefit to us all because if there are no ushers and no cleaners there can be no "open church".

All of the above is for your safety and the protection of all. It is not meant to be unwelcoming as some have written and expressed. We have entered into challenging times.
