On this second Sunday of Easter, we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. We celebrate this feast today since God's mercy was shared with us through the resurrection of Jesus. To put it simply, today, we are celebrating Jesus' merciful love for us and how we can partake in it.

No matter where we are on our journey as a disciple of Christ, we are all in need of God's merciful love. There are countless times throughout our day when we miss the mark. "RED ZONE" PROTOCOLS

Parishioners are reminded that, as they leave Mass, physical distancing has to be adhered to. It appears that what has been working well for the initial seating and the moving forward for Holy Communion. It is falling apart when it comes to leaving the church: even though the ushers are there to escort everyone out, "bunching up" tends to occur as people feel the need to walk faster. The message has to be reinforced: pace yourselves accordingly, please, and be mindful of the directions given by the ushers!

Physical distancing has to be respected not only on the way into church and in the Communion line, but when leaving the building, too (and around the doors, once outside). Registration will be required for all weekend Masses. The deadline is each Thursday by 12 Noon. This is not happening. You cannot email the night before or the morning of. Also, a curtesy phone call is better than an email if you cannot attend after having previously registered. Not showing up without notifying us means that others could have had your spot.

Sandy, is responsible for Mass Registration. Kindly, do not email or text or phone Father Christopher for registration or cancellation. Sandy works only on Tuesday and Thursday. All emails are returned with confirmation.

Arriving at least 15/10 minutes prior will help us to place you in your seat. Keeping a prayerful silence both in the foyer and as you enter the main church building will help us all prepare for Mass.
