PASTOR'S EASTER MESSAGE

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Jesus Christ.

I greet you personally today as you read and reflect on my musings. I doubt any of us would ever say we like to experience defeat in our lives. At least for me, I would rather be a part of a winning team than a losing team. My friend, I pray that you remember it's because of Christ's Resurrection over 2,000 years ago that the victory WAS, IS, and WILL BE ours!

I have been wrestling with how we continue to serve those who are falling through the cracks of our social structures and safety nets, particularly those who live in precarious unemployment brought on by the pandemic, those grappling with food insecurity, mental health issues, substance abuse, addictions and domestic violence.

As we eagerly and sometimes fearfully face the ongoing challenges, I want to be sure to continually reach out to you during this challenging time for so many. While few of us are physically back at church, I realize many have chosen to stay away for a while longer. Please know that we certainly understand the desire to stay safe as we continue to go through this unprecedented pandemic. I have little doubt that the Easter season of 50 days, will continue to be quite a bit different watching services online, or quite possibly not at all if that's your choice. I do believe in the tremendous importance of being in church, yet it's different "for now."

I'm becoming more convinced that God continues to speak to us most powerfully in our times of suffering and loss, and particularly in this pandemic. In this time of suffering for the whole Church, we are all called to listen carefully to what God is trying to say to us. We are called to change. But many of us resist change. Throughout this time of the pandemic, we are doing more than just treading water ... we are growing. I believe we are growing in trust of one another, and deeper still, in trust that God has this whole situation in hand. And trust calls us to be faithful and to be prepared as we travel forward.

I'm asking myself these days, and others some uncomfortable questions all over again. Does the church still matter – even when it's online? When the world has been turned upside down? As our relationships fray and our rhythms are tossed about, we're hungry enough to enjoy whatever church we can get. Even if it's just scraps. When we're scattered across our region unable to fully gather in person while remaining at 30% capacity. How do we encourage others to continue with their weekly parish stewardship while physically absent?

But I'm also learning to embrace the limitations of this wilderness season. Maybe Covid is an opportunity to lean into our spiritual hunger – for connection, for transcendence, for meaning. We can turn our living rooms into sacred spaces, dimming lights, lighting candles and burning incense. We can pray with those we love, paying fresh attention to the faces of our family apart in body, but together in spirit. We can even carry one another's fears and grief, our anxieties and uncertainties, and hold them together before a trustworthy God.

This Easter, amidst all the suffering and anxiety of so many, I invite you, wherever you may be in terms of your faith journey, to take up that ever-present invitation; to turn around and walk with Christ – that, "He may 'enlighten the eyes of our mind so that we can see what HOPE - His call holds for us' (Ephesians 1:17-18)

Please be sure to contact me with your pastoral or personal concerns so that I may share the gifts of the Holy Spirit through presence and connection. I've most certainly felt that welcomed presence and connection with our ACTS brothers and sisters, my supportive Men's Fraternity (brothers) with our two programs: That Man Is You, and Into The Breach. My friends and colleagues at the Mental Health Centre in Hamilton, and Gethsemane Ministries in Wellandport, Smithville Christian Reformed Church, Lakemont Evangelical Grimsby, Principal, Vice- Principal and Staff at St. Martin Catholic Elementary School. And last but not least you dear friends of St. Martin.

May God bless you and your loved ones with peace, strength, and good health. Pray for me, as I pray for you!



BISHOP BERGIES EASTER MESSAGE

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ

One of the most meaningful scripture passages for me involves the mystery of the Resurrection of Jesus. It is about the two disciples on the Road to Emmaus.

On Easter Sunday morning, they are on the road leaving Jerusalem and returning to their home town. We are told that these disciples are dejected, discouraged and lacking any sense of hope. The reason is that, because Jesus suffered and died like an ordinary man, He could not possibly be the great Messiah. They felt foolish because they had believed in Him.

On the road they meet the Risen Jesus but they did not recognize Him. This encounter is transformational as the disciples walk with Him and listen to His words. It is only in the 'breaking of the bread', that their eyes are finally opened and they understand that this man is Jesus, the Risen Lord. This realization fills them with great joy and a renewed sense of hope.

This past year has been a long and difficult journey due to the ever present pandemic. So many are suffering from "COVID fatigue". We can identify with those disciples on the road, who walked with heavy hearts filled with discouragement. The needed some 'good news', and this is what Jesus offered to them. It is also offered to us.

Our good news is the Resurrection. Jesus has truly risen from the dead and this fact brings great hope. Just as this brought comfort and joy to the two disciples, it should also do the same for us on our own life's journey.

On Easter Sunday, may your participation in the 'breaking of the bread, the Holy Eucharist', open your eyes to the presence of our Risen Lord. Despite the difficulties we may be facing at this present moment, let us take comfort in the fact that the Lord walks with us and shares a message of love and new life.
