THE GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

On the day of *Pentecost = Greek & Latin languages for the Jewish Festival of Weeks*, God the Father and God the Son joined in sending God the Holy Spirit into the world in a permanent way. This means that until that day, which was 50 days after the resurrection of Jesus at Easter, the Holy Spirit was at work only in selective situations and with certain people, from the day in which Adam and Eve lost the friendship of God in the Garden of Eden, until Jesus rose from the dead.

When the Holy Spirit came upon the Apostles as they were gathered in Jerusalem, the Paschal Mystery of Jesus was completed. Through the Paschal Mystery – the Lord's passion, death, resurrection, ascension and the coming of the Holy Spirit – God completed all the efforts to make our salvation possible. The sending of the Holy Spirit would make absolute the promise that Jesus had made when he said that he would be with us until the end of time.

The Holy Spirit is the wisdom and love of God, shared between the Father and Son, and from them, to all who are baptized.

From the day of Pentecost to our day, and until the end of time, the Holy Spirit is the Person within God who brings all that God shares with us. This sharing is what is called the *Gifts of the Holy Spirit*.

There are seven gifts that are brought to us. Every baptized person has them made available to us in the Sacrament of Baptism by Christ. In the Sacrament of Confirmation Christ strengthens us by using these gifts to make us confirmed or solid in the example of being followers of his.

These gifts have a thinking (Wisdom, Understanding, Council) and an activity (Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety, Fear of the Lord) aspect to them.

1. Wisdom: helps us to discover the value that God has given to something.
2. Understanding: helps us know what we believe in our faith, and why.
3. Counsel: helps us find the best way to serve God every day.
4. Fortitude: helps us to stand up for what we believe in.
5. Knowledge: helps us know when a person or thing will lead us to God or away from God.
6. Piety: helps us to respond to God in the way that He deserves.
7. Fear of the Lord: helps us to remember that we depend upon God.

FEASTS TODAY

Pentecost; June 4.

The word *Pentecost* comes from the Greek language, meaning *the fiftieth day*. This feast celebrates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles fifty days after Easter. This day is commonly regarded as the birthday of the Church because once the Holy Spirit came upon the apostles they carried the message of Christ to the known world.

The feast of Pentecost is also known as *Whitsunday*. This is from the original Greek name given to this day when it was celebrated as the Jewish Feast of Weeks, which fell on the fiftieth day after Passover.

So important is Pentecost that until the year 1969 the Sundays between Pentecost and Advent were called the Sundays after Pentecost. Since the year 1969 they have been called Sundays in Ordinary Time.

FEASTS THIS WEEK

The Most Holy Trinity; June 11.

We recall the relationship that exists within God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Heresies in the 4th and 5th centuries led to the establishment of the Nicene Creed, and more careful teaching about the relationship within the persons of God. In the 7th and 8th centuries Mass prayers were created to celebrate the Trinity. In the year 1162 Archbishop (St) Thomas Beckett (bishop & martyr, year 1170, December 29) decreed that on the octave after Pentecost, there would be a feast of the Most Holy Trinity to mark the anniversary of his ordination as Bishop of Canterbury, England.

This universal feast dates to the year 1334.

SAINTS THIS WEEK

St. Boniface, bishop & martyr; June 05.

Boniface was born in England about the year 680. Ordained a priest at the age of thirty, he became a missionary, teaching in the Netherlands and Germany. He was ordained a bishop in the year 722. In the year 731, he was made an archbishop. His reforms brought restored life to the Church.

He was martyred, with 52 companions, on June 05, 754 while he prepared to celebrate the sacrament of confirmation.

His feast was introduced in the year 1874, at the request of the First Vatican Council.

St. Barnabas, apostle; June 11.

Barnabas was a Jew of the priestly tribe of Levi, born in Cyprus. His original name was Joseph, but when he sold his farm and gave the money to the apostles for the care of the poor, he was renamed Barnabas. He then went to preach the gospel in Antioch. In time he travelled with (St) Paul, then spent time with (St) Mark the evangelist. It is thought that he wrote the New Testament letter to the Hebrews. He was stoned to death in Cyprus in the year 60.

His feast dates to the eleventh century.
