SAINTS THIS WEEK

St. Paul Mikki and Companions, martyrs; February 6.

Christianity came to Japan in the year 1549. At first, the missionaries were welcomed, as they respected the local customs. By the year 1551 there were over a thousand converts. In the year 1588 the Emperor banned all missionaries, after he was told that missionaries worked to prepare the country for conquest.

In the year 1597 the Emperor condemned 26 people to death. Paul Miki - a Japanese national, a Jesuit and leader in his community and 25 others - 2 other Jesuits, 6 Franciscans and 17 lay Catholics - were martyred near Nagasaki on February 05 of that year. All were canonized on June 08, 1862 by Pope Pius IX.

St. Scholastica, virgin & founder; February 10.

Scholastica, the twin sister of (St) Benedict, was born in Italy in the year 480. She vowed herself in service to God, following her brother when he established his monastery at Monte Cassino. She ruled over a group of nuns, 8 kilometres from Benedict's monastery. A woman of remarkable faith and courage, she was deeply devoted to the Blessed Sacrament. She died peacefully, in the year 543.

This feast was celebrated before the end of the eighth century.

FEASTS THIS WEEK

Our Lady of Lourdes; February 11.

On this date in the year 1858 three little girls set out from the town of Lourdes, France, to pick up sticks of wood. One of the children, Bernadette Soubirous, was visited by the Blessed Virgin Mary. Between February 11 and July 16, eighteen times the Blessed Mother appeared to Bernadette. No one other than Bernadette ever saw the Blessed Mother. No visit was made at Lourdes after July 16. The name by which the Blessed Mother identified herself was the *Immaculate Conception*. At 22 years old Bernadette joined an order of religious nursing sisters. She died in the year 1878.



in God and not in our own qualities or abilities. If we are humble servants of the truth, then God's power will be shown. The Communications Department of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops provides "Catholics, especially families, with information they can use to evaluate entertainment media programming from a Catholic perspective." Along with its "Family Guide for Using Media," it provides up-to-date movie reviews and ratings through the Catholic News Service (catholicnews.com) and access to archives dating from 2010 into the 1930s.

As part of forming their children in the faith, parents must educate them about the media's influence, monitor the content each member interacts with, and model appropriate media use. All our media choices-print, digital, or otherwise-should affirm and support Christian values. Consider these questions:



- Does this piece portray human life as a gift from God? Is sexuality linked to life and marriage? How is dying presented?
- Does it promote healthy friendships and lasting commitments within marriage? Does it affirm gratitude, stewardship or charity, and obedience to proper authorities?
- Does it connect moral consequences with the characters' actions? Is exploitation, oppression, or neglect of any group condoned? Is respect shown for a variety of cultures?
- Does it foster a sense of the divine, of human destiny beyond this life, and of our obligation to forgive and seek forgiveness?

It is advisable to balance your use of suitable media with human interaction.
